Choir

This choral course is open to all students. Students will have the opportunity to individually become better vocalists and learn a lot about vocal production usable for all musical styles. It is a linear course (yearlong) and meets twice a week. Students will learn various styles of music including jazz, pop, classical, gospel and folk. The focus of this group is to enjoy music, become better musicians/singers, make new friends and have fun. Participation in Music Festivals and travelling abroad is also a possibility!

Strings

Strings Orchestra including Violin, Viola, Cello, and Double Bass. Minimum two years of experience on your instrument is required. Students will hone their skills and rehearse repertoire for local festivals and concerts.

Concert Band

Concert Band is a core ensemble focused on developing music literacy and instrumental performance skills. It is a linear (year-long) course that meets two to three times a week. This course includes performances throughout the school year as well as participation in workshops with professional musicians. Students participating in Concert Band are expected to practice a minimum of 100 minutes per week on their instrument.

Junior Jazz Band

The Esquimalt Junior Jazz Band is an introduction to big band jazz performance at the high school level. This is achieved through performance of quality big band jazz repertoire in a variety of styles: Funk, Swing, Latin, Rock, Shuffle, Ballad and more! This ensemble meets Monday and Thursday morning at 7am and is comprised of students from Grades 9/10 respectively. The Esquimalt Jr. Jazz band is proud to participate in the annual West Coast Jazz Festival with students and the ensemble receiving high praise and awards along with consecutive invitations to Nationals. In order to provide an even broader musical experience, all Jazz Band students are required to rehearse and perform with the Esquimalt Concert Band.

Vocal Jazz

The Esquimalt Vocal Ensemble meets twice a week and is comprised of students from Grades 9 to 12. Vocalists will work on developing good vocal technique through vocal jazz and pop music. This ensemble participates in vocal clinics and performances throughout the school year. Vocal Ensemble also rehearses with a rhythm section (bass, drums, guitar, piano).

Musical Theatre

This class is designed to provide students with experience in the artistic/ creative process through participation in all aspects of play production. Esquimalt Musical Theatre offers a plethora of options to choose from including: Cast, Crew, Lighting, Costume Design, and Pit Orchestra. The nature of this course is to provide hands-on learning experiences through participation and project management.

Improv

Improvisational performance is the skill of creating unscripted theatre fueled by audience suggestions. Improv helps students develop competencies which improve confidence, interpersonal skills, quick thinking, adaptability, creativity, flexibility and collaboration. Indigenous Humanities (English 9 and Social Studies 9)

The Indigenous Humanities course combines English Language Arts and Socials Studies curriculum and takes place over two blocks across the school year.

The class is grounded in Indigenous Ways of Knowing and incorporates multiple paths of learning while exploring historical and contemporary Indigenous themes. In this course, students will develop their academic resilience, study habits and literacy skills which are necessary to successfully reach the English and Socials Studies learning outcomes of this course, and future courses.

Some of the topics investigated in this course are: identity, worldviews and perspectives, and the influences of power, culture and the physical environment on shaping society. Students will learn through exploring various texts, media, outdoor learning and community connections, while developing their reading, writing and oral communication skills.

Our goal is for students to develop a strong sense of place and self within the broader community. Indigenous Humanities is open to all students.

Ongoing Supports to Assure Student Success

We have a number of supports and programs in place to make sure our students have the resources, learning and help they need. Some of the supports we offer include: Learning Hubs (ongoing course credit support in Math/Science/Humanities), Linear/Adapted Math 9, ELL inclass assistance and courses, homework help, Elder in residence, Mindfulness Group, community connections and Foundational Skills class.


