## Things to keep in mind...

- What do you want to get out of your high school experience?
- What opportunities do you want to take advantage of? Dual credit? AP? Electives?

- What Post Secondary options do you want to consider? Do some research! (Look at websites under PROSPECTIVE Students--admission requirements) • UVIC Four Academic 12s (Many schools require 5)
  - STEM will require Chem and Physics 11 plus Pre Calculus 11
  - Many students opt to do University Transfer or diploma programs and credentials at Camosun
  - Many schools look at grade 11 courses for prerequisites, but most do not use for entrance GPA (will have minimum grades)






