Graduation Requirements

In grades 10, 11 and 12 you must earn 80 credits in three years:

- 52 credits in required courses
- 28 credits from elective courses
- 4 credit Indigenous focused course
- Career Life Education
- Career Life Connections
- Numeracy Assessment in Grade 11
- Literacy Assessment in Grade 10 & Grade 12
- FRAL Literacy Assessment in Grade 12 (French Immersion)
- *Courses are worth 4 credits
- *Take 8 courses minimum in Grades 10 and 11

- Required for graduation

- Capstone project in Grade 12





Numeracy and Literacy Assessments

- Grade 10 Numeracy and Literacy are both required for graduation
- Grade 12 Literacy Assessment
- *FRAL 12 Literacy Assessment
 *French Immersion only

- Contact a school counsellor ASAP
