

Graduation Requirements

In grades 10, 11 and 12 you must earn 80 credits in three years:

- 52 credits in required courses
- 28 credits from elective courses
- 4 credits Indigenous focused course
- Career Life Education
- Career Life Connections
- Numeracy Assessment in grade 10
- Literacy Assessment in grade 10, grade 12

Courses are worth 4 credits

Take 8 courses minimum in grades 10 and 11




