


Things to keep in mind...

- What do you want to get out of your high school experience?
- What opportunities do you want to take advantage of? Dual credit? AP? Electives?

- **What Post Secondary options do you want to consider? Do some research!** (Look at websites under PROSPECTIVE Students--admission requirements)
 - UVIC Four Academic 12s (Many schools require 5)
 - STEM will require Chem and Physics 11 plus Pre Calculus 11
 - Many students opt to do University Transfer or diploma programs and credentials at Camosun
 - Many schools look at grade 11 courses for prerequisites, but most do not use for entrance GPA (will have minimum grades)



Graduation Requirements

In grades 10, 11 and 12 you must earn 80 credits in three years:


- 52 credits in required courses
- 28 credits from elective courses
- 4 credits of an Indigenous focused course
- Career Life Education
- Career Life Connections
- Numeracy Assessment in Grade 10
- Literacy Assessments in Grade 10 & Grade 12
- FRAL Literacy Assessment in Grade 12 (French Immersion)

* Courses are worth 4 credits

* Take 8 courses minimum in grades 10 and 11
